Introduction to ASC and its Hepatitis B Program

- ASC is a non-profit organization dedicated to improving the health and self-sufficiency of the African community in New York City and beyond by offering health, housing, legal, educational, and social services.
- Since viral hepatitis is endemic to 8-20% of the African continent, ASC's HBV program increase access free education. testing, treatment, and linkage to care for viral hepatitis to reduce liver deaths African cancer among immigrants

ASC's Hepatitis B Program during COVID-19

- ASC temporarily closed March-June 2020 due to the COVID-19 Pandemic and re-opened on July 6th, 2020
- Since reopening, ASC has resumed on-site Hepatitis B screenings. However, testing rates have declined significantly in comparison to those pre-pandemic
- Between July 6th, 2020 and April 2021, ASC has:
 - Tested **a total of 134 clients** (about **13 clients per month**) for Hepatitis B. All positive clients were linked to care; susceptible clients were offered the Heplisav 2-dose vaccine at ASC or opted to use their own provider for vaccination; immune clients were notified of their results; isolated core-antibody positive clients were provided relevant counseling on Hepatitis B reactivation
 - Hosted 2 testing events at community places of worship/centers where 13 clients were tested
 - Hosted 2 educational workshops in English and French on Hepatitis B virtually and in-person for a total of 28 participants (with two more scheduled for the upcoming months)
