# **Health Care & Prevention**

#### Asian Free Clinic and the Hepatitis B Free Clinic

Most encounters are seniors with chronic disease, offering medical services for diabetes, high cholesterol, high blood pressure, liver function, body pain and similar health issues. Hepatitis B screenings are offered to at risk patients.

Follow-up care is provided for Hepatitis B positive patients found at the AFC and the community hep B screenings.



#### **2017 Recommendation**


- Cut amount of work for the teacher

- Changes made to the parental survey (questionaire)


#### 2018 Lessons Learned

Mother's Country of Birth -WCHS and Metro HS Test Scores: Pre, Post, F/U, and Parental. WCHS






#### WCHS Student's Comfort Level to Explain to their Parents
