

Hepatitis B: Confronting Stigma and Dismantling Discrimination

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Stigma (health)

- Being devalued by individuals or communities on the basis of real or perceived health status

Discrimination (health)

- The legal, institutional and procedural ways people are denied access to their rights because of their real or perceived health status

More general definition:

- The unjust or prejudicial treatment of different categories of people, especially on the grounds of race, age, or sex

Why is there stigma and discrimination associated with a vaccine preventable disease?

Overcoming Structural Barriers

- Provide Enabling Services
 - Multilingual services
 - Transportation
 - Outreach
- Address Social Determinants of Health
- Create Safe Space
- Normalize hepatitis B testing, vaccination, and treatment
- Show that Hepatitis B does not define individuals

Stigma: Who should be held accountable?

- Perpetuated by fear and discrimination
- Need to change perceptions
- Ensure access to accurate information
- Speak up if you witness stigma or discrimination

Definitive Cure for Hepatitis B Related Stigma

- Empower individuals and communities
- Eliminate institutional discrimination at the societal level
